Call to Worship

Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Preparation for the Lord's Supper

Words of Institution

from Matthew 26:17-29

On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus. They did as He had directed them, and prepared the Passover. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

Confession of Sin

Almighty God, in raising Your Son from the grave, You shattered the power of sin and death. By Your Spirit, You caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. You promise an inheritance that is imperishable, but we have succumbed to doubt, fear, and perishable ways that lead to death. You promise to reveal Your salvation, but we have grown impatient and rebellious. We have been overwhelmed by grief and trial, and our faith and love wears thin. Forgive us, Father of mercy. We long to see our risen Lord. Grant us faith to believe in Him, and teach us to long for that Day of inexpressible joy filled with glory, in Jesus Christ, the risen Lord. Amen.

Confession & Encouragement Often we find that our hearts worship something other than God. In confessing our sins, the Holy Spirit probes our hearts and minds and graciously shows us what we mistakenly believe will give us life. Jesus is good to lead us from sorrow over our sin to the sweetness of His grace.
