Daniel 4:29-37

At the end of twelve months he [King Nebuchadnezzar] was walking on the roof of the royal palace of Babylon, and the king answered and said, "Is not this great Babylon, which I have built by my mighty power as a royal residence and for the glory of my majesty?"
