## That I May Gain Christ

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Philippians 3:4-8

<sup>4</sup> though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: <sup>5</sup> circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup> as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. <sup>7</sup> But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. <sup>8</sup> Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ

For Further Discussion...

- When do you feel confident? Why?
- The Apostle Paul uses the word "confidence" twice in today's text. In your own words, what does "confidence in the flesh" mean? (4)
- Paul has got a lot to boast in. Look at his list of achievements and credentials (5-6). Why would each one be valuable to Paul & his culture? What would be the equivalent of each boast in your own life and culture?

"Circumcised on the eighth day"

"Of the people of Israel"

"Of the tribe of Benjamin"

"A Hebrew of Hebrews"

"As to the law, a Pharisee"

"As to zeal, a persecutor of the church"

"As to righteousness under the law, blameless"

- Why does Paul consider his credentials and achievements (and yours) "loss" and "rubbish"?
- Paul is talking about a deep truth that is very difficult for us: We not only need to repent of our sins, we must repent of our righteousness. What is one false way you are tempted to feel righteous? What would it look like to count that selfgenerated righteousness a loss?
- Paul takes on a terrible caricature of Christianity: Moralism.
  A view that being a Christian is basically being good & keeping score.
  How does Moralism steal our joy?
- In your own words, summarize what Paul is saying is the most valuable thing in life. (7-8)
- Pray together in light of this week's passage.
