This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Philippians 4:1

¹ Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

For Further Discussion

- Paul loves this church. Why?
- Paul uses a word for "crown" that does not describe a king's crown. Rather this is the crown awarded to a victorious athlete, or the crown guests of honor were crowned with at a joyful banquet or party. Why were the Philippians Paul's crown of victory or celebration?
- What people cause you to rejoice in the Lord?
- What **people** has God used to give you a sense of **Christ's** victory? Why is this so?
- In the section that immediately preceded this verse, Paul called for the **purity of the church** in the face of empty religion. What does it mean to **stand firm in the Lord** when dealing with the **threat that comes from self-righteous religion**?
- In the section that follows this verse, Paul will plead for the **peace of the church**. What does it mean **to stand firm in the Lord** when the **peace of the church is at stake**?
- Pray together in light of this week's passage.
