Christ Came to Fulfill the Law

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Matthew 5:17-20.

¹⁷ "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. ¹⁸ For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

- In this Advent season, we remember that God became incarnate once to accomplish our salvation, and that He will come again. Do you ever yearn for the Second Coming of Jesus Christ? When do you find yourself looking forward to His Second Advent?

- When will "all be accomplished", and what is life like when "all is accomplished"? (18)
- What is purpose of God's Scriptures?
- How would you summarize Jesus' view of the Old Testament Scriptures? (17-18)
- What relationship does Jesus see between understanding the Scripture and our place in His Kingdom? (19)
- The scribes and Pharisees were extremely committed to observing the Old Testament. So, what does Jesus mean by His statement in verse 20?
- Pray together in light of this week's passage.
