

A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families for the week of February 13, 2022

Prayer

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Matthew 6:5-15

⁵ "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ⁶ But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁷ "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. ⁸ Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. ⁹ Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. ¹⁰ Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread, ¹² and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

¹⁴ For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, ¹⁵ but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

- This is the first of two weeks we will consider this section of Jesus Sermon on the Mount. At its heart, what is "prayer"?
- What contrast does Jesus set up in vv5-8?
- Focus on vv5-6. What do the "hypocrites" love as they pray? What does Jesus encourage you to see as you pray?
- Focus on vv7-8. The "Gentiles" seek to manipulate God. How? What encouragement does Jesus offer us instead?
- Do you know God is your Heavenly Father? If so, can you give an example of how that has changed the way you pray?
- After sitting under Jesus teaching this week, has your definition of prayer changed? If so, how?
- What are you talking to your Heavenly Father about these days? Pray together in light of this week's passage.
