



A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families for the week of March 6, 2022

Two Treasures, Two Visions, Two Masters

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from [Matthew 6:19-24](#)

¹⁹“Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

²²“The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, ²³but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

²⁴“No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.

- **What exactly is Jesus prohibiting** when He tells us not to lay up treasures on earth (19)? Saving, possessions, and private property? Something else?
- How does someone go about **laying up treasures in heaven** (21)? What is **something that is valuable in heaven** that might not appear valuable here?
- For Jesus, what would be the **characteristics of a “healthy eye”** (22)? A **“bad eye”** (23)?
- **Why** is it **impossible to serve two masters** (24)?
- *Where is your treasure; What has your eye; Who is your master?* For Jesus, all of these are really questions that ask, *“To what have you given your heart?”* **Is there anything, good or bad, other than Jesus that has captured your heart this week? Why** was it so captivating? **What do you need the Holy Spirit to do to renew your disoriented, sick, and ambivalent heart?**
- Remember that the One teaching here submitted to His Heavenly Father to become poor and has never taken His eye off of His beloved Church. How does the **single-hearted passion of Jesus for you strengthen you** for following Him?
- **Pray together** in light of this week's passage.
