

A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families for the week of June 5, 2022

Birth of Esau & Jacob

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Genesis 25:19-27

¹⁹ These are the generations of Isaac, Abraham's son: Abraham fathered Isaac, ²⁰ and Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah, the daughter of Bethuel the Aramean of Paddanaram, the sister of Laban the Aramean, to be his wife. ²¹ And Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, because she was barren. And the LORD granted his prayer, and Rebekah his wife conceived. ²² The children struggled together within her, and she said, "If it is thus, why is this happening to me?" So she went to inquire of the LORD. ²³ And the LORD said to her,

"Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you shall be divided; the one shall be stronger than the other, the older shall serve the younger."

²⁴ When her days to give birth were completed, behold, there were twins in her womb. ²⁵ The first came out red, all his body like a hairy cloak, so they called his name Esau. ²⁶ Afterward his brother came out with his hand holding Esau's heel, so his name was called Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them.

²⁷ When the boys grew up, Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, dwelling in tents.

- Have you ever felt competitive with someone? What did they have that you wanted?
- What was Isaac's prayer to the LORD? Why would this be of such importance to him? What matters of the heart might Isaac and Rebekah be struggling with? (19-21)
- Isaac was forty years old when he married Rebekah (20); He was sixty when she gave birth (26). Isaac & Rebekah sorrowed and waited for some 20 years in prayer to the LORD. What are you praying and waiting for? What kinds of things happen in a heart that is praying and waiting?
- After the twins were conceived, Rebekah worries about her future and her strange pregnancy symptoms. She asks "Why is this happening to me?" (22), first in general, and then of the LORD. In your own life, when do you worry, and what does it take for you to bring your anxious fears to your Heavenly Father?
- Rebekah conceived and the twins "struggled together within her". What did the LORD reveal Rebekah about her children? (22-23)
- What else do we learn about Esau & Jacob as the boys grow up? (24-27)
- In the New Testament, the apostle Paul reflects on the account of Esau & Jacob (Romans 9:10-16). In their story, Paul sees God's sovereignty and mercy. How? We will continue to explore God's gracious purposes in election in coming weeks.
- It is important to remember that God's people longed and waited thousands of years for the promised Messiah. And God kept his promise in His fullness of time (Galatians 4:4-7). Repent and pray together in light of this week's passage.
