

A Worship Study Guide for Individuals, Groups and Families for the week of July 24, 2022

The LORD Saw That Leah Was Hated

This week, Pastor Steve Shelby preached from Genesis 29:31-35

³¹ When the LORD saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb, but Rachel was barren. ³² And Leah conceived and bore a son, and she called his name Reuben, for she said, "Because the LORD has looked upon my affliction; for now my husband will love me." ³³ She conceived again and bore a son, and said, "Because the LORD has heard that I am hated, he has given me this son also." And she called his name Simeon. ³⁴ Again she conceived and bore a son, and said, "Now this time my husband will be attached to me, because I have borne him three sons." Therefore his name was called Levi. ³⁵ And she conceived again and bore a son, and said, "This time I will praise the LORD." Therefore she called his name Judah. Then she ceased bearing.

- Jacob loved Rachel more than Leah, and served Laban for another seven years. (Genesis 29:30). Now, we are given a window into Leah's next seven years. Where do you have to endure with patience and trust, even through pain?
- The covenant name of "the LORD" is mentioned here for the first time in this story, then repeatedly. Why might that be significant?
- Leah bears four sons, and the meaning of each son's name is associated with the comments made by Leah:
 - Reuben means "See, a Son" (32). However, what does Leah long for?
 - Simeon sounds like the Hebrew for "Hear" (33). However, what does Leah long for?
 - Levi sounds like the Hebrew for "Attach" (34). However, what does Leah long for?
 - Judah sounds like the Hebrew for "Praise" (35). At the naming of Judah, is Leah resigned? Resolved? Triumphant?
 What is going on here?
- From the outset, Jacob loved Rachel and found Leah undesirable. Yet, it is Leah who bears sons while Rachel is barren. What do you think this stretch of years was like for

Leah? For Rachel? What might be going on in the hearts of each woman?

- Do you have any place in your life where you constantly feel like a failure, passed over, or unloved? How does this sort of experience wear on your heart? What temptations do you experience?
- Life in this fallen world is one of constant longing. We groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling (<u>II Corinthians 5:2</u>). And creation itself waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God (<u>Romans 8:19</u>). Our hearts will never be satisfied or rest in anything less that God Himself. Repent and pray together in light of this week's passage. Thank the LORD for all of His blessings, especially for the gift of Jesus, our heart's True Longing and the Desire of Nations (<u>Haggai 2:7</u>).

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
