Read through this guide before meeting with the group. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for the time of meeting together, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

### Sermon: *My Soul Thirsts*

This week, Steve Shelby preached on [Psalm 143](#).

#### Desperate Prayer

- "The best prayers I have ever heard in our prayer meetings have been those which have been fullest of argument. Sometimes my soul has been fairly melted down where I have listened to the brethren who have come before God feeling the mercy to be really needed, and that they must have it, for they first pleaded with God to give it for this reason, and then for a second, and then for a third and then for a fourth and a fifth until they have awakened the fervency of the entire assembly." (*Charles Spurgeon*)
- "She knew that was not an honest prayer, and she did not linger over it. The right prayer would have been, Lord . . . I am miserable and bitter at heart, and old fears are rising up in me so that everything I do makes everything worse." (*Marilynne Robinson*)

#### What is David Praying For?

- 1.) David is Praying To Be Heard
  - How can I know God is listening? He is quite desperate. Pray out loud and pray the Bible.
  - "Christian meditation, Christian spirituality is oral and tangible. We do not experience God in the silence of our hearts; and while we can marvel at the power of God and discern His glory from creation, we cannot know His will from beholding a sunset, mountain, or ocean. We only know His will from His Word." (*Christopher Esgot*)
- 2.) David is Praying for Safety
  - David recognizes that he has very real enemies. Typically we think of enemies of the believer as the world, the flesh and the devil. There actually may be physical enemies. But the worst enemy is in verse 2. How can one be safe from that enemy? He appeals to mercy yes, but to righteousness.
- 3.) David is Praying To Do What God Wanted Him to Do
  - What is the point of living if God does not help us know what He wants us to do. (vv. 8, 10)
  - Don't let sin keep you from God.
  - Argue with God. State your case.

- 2.) Did the Holy Spirit convict, change, or encourage you in any way you wish to share with the group?
- 3.) Is Jesus leading you or the group to take a specific risk to minister the Good News to Richmond? Your neighbors? Your co-workers? Your family and friends?

- 1.) Have the Scripture text open in front of you as a guide to your prayers.
  - Spend time thanking God and giving Him glory.
- 2.) Ask the Lord for vision, strength and faith as followers of Jesus Christ.
  - Count on the work of the Holy Spirit for change.
  - Ask for God's forgiveness and grace to repent of sin and trust Jesus.
  - Pray for the world, our country, Richmond, and the Church.
  - Pray for members of your group, family members, or co-workers, neighbors and friends.
