Praise Him

This week, Steve Shelby preached on Psalm 148.

Praise the LORD from the heavens; praise him in the heights! ¹ ² Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his hosts! ¹ ³ Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars! ⁴ Praise him, you highest heavens, and you waters above the heavens! ⁵ Let them praise the name of the LORD! For he commanded and they were created. ⁶ And he established them forever and ever; he gave a decree, and it shall not pass away. ⁷ Praise the LORD from the earth,	 ⁹ Mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars! ¹⁰ Beasts and all livestock, creeping things and flying birds! ¹¹ Kings of the earth and all peoples, princes and all rulers of the earth! ¹² Young men and maidens together, old men and children! ¹³ Let them praise the name of the LORD, for his name alone is exalted; his majesty is above earth and heaven. ¹⁴ He has raised up a horn for his people, praise for all his saints, for the people of Israel who are near to him. Praise the LORD!

- Psalm 148 begins with a call to worship God the Creator from the heavens. Then it works itself down to Angels, Hosts Sun & Moon, Stars, the Earth, the Sea & all that is in it, the Weather, Mountains, Trees, Beasts, Livestock, Creepers, Birds, Kings, Princes, Rulers, and the Young and the Old.
- The foundation of our faith is found in these words, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1).
- In the Apostles' Creed, we begin by saying, "I believe in the God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth." Everything in the • universe that is not God is a created thing.
- All of this was done by His Word, "He commanded and they were created" (5). God addresses His command to nothingness-- and it obeys.
- Not only does the Bible say God created by His Word, He upholds it by His Word. "He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Hebrews 1:3).
- God owns everything and everyone. Everything exists for God and His glory.
- But the pinnacle of our relationship with God is not that we are created and belong to Him but, His redeeming love. "He has raised up a horn for his people, praise for all his saints, for the people of Israel, who are near to him" (14).

"Blessed be the Lord God of Israel. for he has visited and redeemed his people and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David. as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old, that we should be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us: to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, the oath that he swore to our father Abraham, to grant us that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness before him all our days."
